Strategically located in New York City's lowest resourced communities, Good Shepherd Services' network of programs build on community strengths and promote growth and change.

CREATING Youth Leadership Opportunities

89% of participants in our elementary and middle school afterschool programs developed leadership skills.

ADDRESSING Basic Needs

2,334 of participants in our Single Stop program received assistance accessing services.

PROMOTING Academic Achievement

1,046 of students who were off-track for graduation earned their high school diploma.

BUILDING Family, Strength, Belonging

89% of children discharged from our Family Foster Care program were reunited with birth parents or relatives, or were adopted.

STRENGTHENING Workforce Readiness

88% of students in our partnership schools who had an internship during the school year successfully completed it.

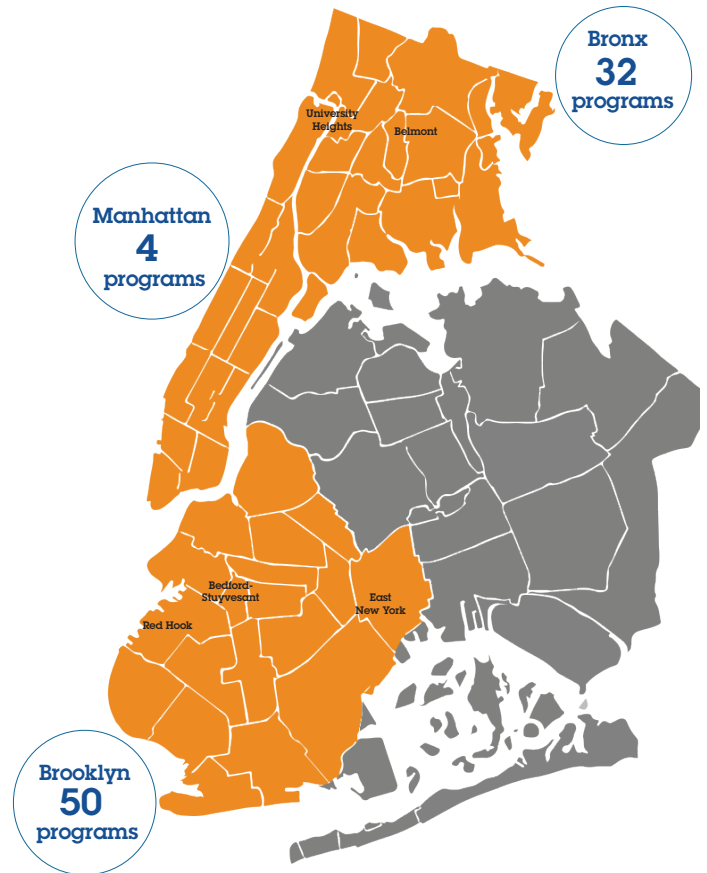

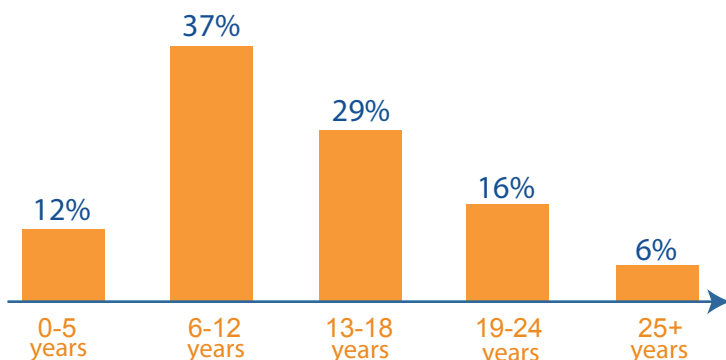
