#### CALL FOR ARTISTS/ ART SUBMISSIONS: Good Shepherd Services Earth Month 2021 Virtual Gallery

#### THEME

Where We Are: A community commitment to and celebration of our Earth

#### DESCRIPTION

This year, Good Shepherd Services will be observing Earth Day for the entire month of April in honor of our collaboration with the Lenape Center NYC in developing our Living Land Acknowledgement, which will be introduced next week to GSS. From April 1<sup>st</sup> to April 30<sup>th</sup>, the Mission and Culture department invites all staff and program participants to submit their artwork to GSS' Earth Month 2021 Virtual Art Gallery. This year's theme is: *"Where We Are: A community commitment to and celebration of our Earth."* 

The *Where We Are* virtual art gallery seeks to connect our commitment to acknowledging the land we live on with honoring Indigenous peoples and cultures and bringing awareness to our fight against climate change. As stated in our Living Land Acknowledgement, it is necessary to recognize our beginnings, history, and realities. We must respect that we are on the original homeland of the Lenape, Lenapehoking, and that there has been a history of atrocities and unjust actions against the Native people. We need to recognize the many challenging realities when continuing our collective work in healing and sustaining the Earth.

Our Living Land Acknowledgement also states: "honoring and respecting Mother Earth (Haki) is central to Lenape culture." This Earth Month, let us recognize the past, present, and future as we celebrate the planet we call home. The Earth offers us many gifts, inspiration, and wisdom. We can look to the Earth's cycles and seasons to better understand the Earth and our own ability of growth, healing, and resilience. This commitment to and celebration of the Earth is the core of how we want to respect Indigenous culture and people and the land that they first cared for.

The Mission and Culture department calls for artists to reflect on these sentiments for the *Where We Are* virtual art gallery combined with attention to your local surroundings, to New York City, to the country as a whole, and/or our entire planet. We invite all artists to use the theme, the description, and the GSS Land Acknowledgement as inspiration to create something original for GSS' Earth Month 2021 Virtual Art Gallery. **All mediums of art are accepted including visual, dance, music, film, poetry, photography, etc.** Please contact <u>mission\_culture@goodshepherds.org</u> for questions and/or concerns.

#### More questions to consider when creating can include:

How do we honor Indigenous Peoples or our ancestors who have come before us? How can we listen more deeply to Mother Earth? What promise or commitment can I make beyond Earth Day? How can we extend our GSS values to our relationship with the earth?

\*If you have multiple works you would like to submit, you must submit one form per submission (i.e., If you have a painting and a video of you dancing, you must submit the form once for your painting and again for your video).
