Our Data-Driven Programming Has Powerful Impact

Housing Stability

85% of Chelsea Foyer supportive housing graduates transitioned to stable housing.



Developmental Opportunities

94% of afterschool participants surveyed indicated that the program has helped them develop leadership skills.



Sense of Belonging & Safety

91% of participants surveyed in our Marian Hall residential program indicated that they feel safe and comfortable with staff.



Partnering with Communities

10,141 hours spent by Bronx Rises Against Gun Violence staff canvassing communities to promote safety and peace in the Bronx.



Job Readiness

75% of students in our YABC and Partnership Schools successfully completed their internship.



Family Strengths

93% of families receiving services through our Prevention Programs stayed together and were not involved in abuse or neglect cases.



Academic Achievement

1255 students who needed to catch up in credits re-engaged in high school and earned their diplomas.



91% of children who transitioned from our Family Foster Care program were either reunited with their families, placed permanently with relatives, or adopted.

At Good Shepherd Services, each program is anchored in evidence-informed and trauma-informed practices, spanning our Youth and Family Wellbeing, Education and Vocation, and Community-Based divisions. Our work is fueled by compassion for people and a commitment to providing access to opportunities for children, youth, and families in New York City. We create spaces where individuals feel safe, where they belong, and where they can develop their strengths.

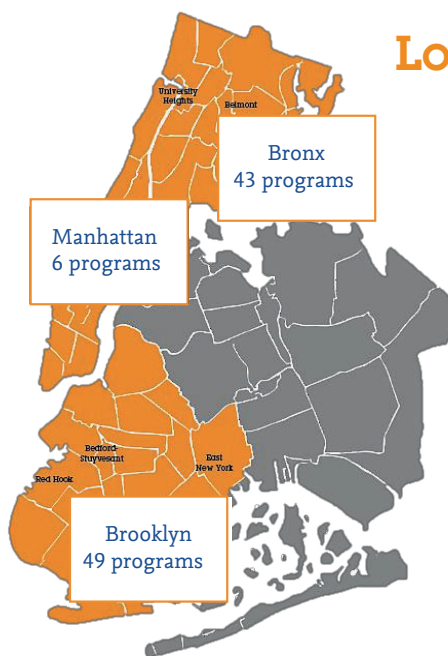

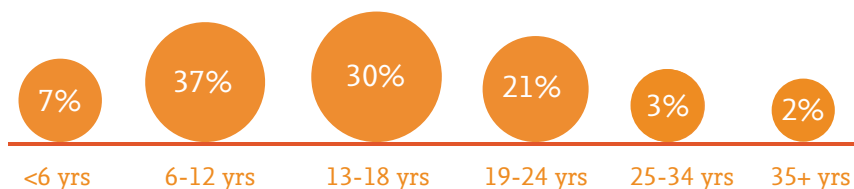
